CODE OF CONDUCT TO BE FOLLOWED BY OUR STUDENTS

- ✚ Identity card is mandatory for students and they should produce whenever it is asked by the college authorities.
- ✚ Students should reach campus by 9.30 a.m. in the morning and should engage in curricular and extra-curricular activities till 4.30 p.m. in the evening.
- ✚ Students should not leave campus without the permission of the teachers.
- ✚ During class time students should avoid wandering in the campus and gathering in the portico and stairs.
- ✚ The students who use vehicles should park in the prescribed area and avoid taking vehicles to other areas in the campus.
- ✚ If there is no class, students should make use of the department libraries, general library. computer lab and health club.

- ✚ Ragging is strictly prohibited in the campus as per the order of the High Court. In case ragging is noticed; the same should be reported to the Principal.
- ✚ Mobile phones are banned in the campus as per the order of the government. If the usage of mobile phones is noticed the same will be seized without further notice.
- ✚ According to government order, use of the drugs in the college is a crime. Both carrying and entering the campus after consuming the same are punishable.
- ✚ Discipline should be maintained in canteen, playground and other public spaces in the campus.
- ✚ The damage and destruction of the assets of the college are punishable activities.
- ✚ Use of plastic is banned in the campus. Use of plastic carry bags and other plastic products in the campus are strictly banned.
- ✚ The class and surroundings should be maintained neat and tidy. Throwing of garbage should be avoided.
- ✚ Pasting posters and writing on college walls should be avoided.
- ✚ There should be utmost care in the use of water and electricity. Whenever they came out of the class, students should ensure switching off of lights and fans.
- ✚ Collecting of funds should not be carried out without the prior permission of the Principal. It is informed that the above code of conduct should be strictly followed and any violation of the same will be taken seriously and disciplinary action will be initiated against the violators.
